



## You may be eligible to save \$2,041.20 or more in Medicare costs through a Medicare Savings Program

If you can't afford Medicare premiums or other medical costs, you may be able to get help. Medicare Savings Programs can help pay for costs under Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) and/or Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance), which could include help with premiums, deductibles, coinsurance, and/or copayments.

The type of help you may qualify for depends on your income and total resources. To qualify for a Medicare Savings Program, your monthly income and total resources (like money in a bank, stocks, or bonds) must be at or below the amounts shown in this table:

Medicare Savings Programs	
2022 <u>Monthly</u> Income Limit*	
Single	Married (living together)
\$1,549	\$2,080
2022 <u>Total</u> Resource Limit**	
Single	Married (living together)
\$8,400	\$12,600

\* The income limits are higher in Alaska and Hawaii. Many states let you have more income than the figures listed above. If you or your spouse work, some of your earned income won't be counted toward your eligibility.

\*\* Some states let you have more resources, and some states may have no resource limit at all. Your house, car, and up to \$1,500 per person in burial expenses **don't count** as resources.

To apply for a Medicare Savings Program, call your State Medical Assistance (Medicaid) office. Visit **Medicare.gov/talk-to-someone** to get the phone number for your state Medicaid office. First, choose your state under “**What state do you live in?**” Then, select “**Other insurance programs,**” and find the state Medicaid program on the list. You can also call **1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) (TTY 1-877-486-2048)** to get the phone number for your state Medicaid office.
